Do you want help giving up smoking?

At Stone Cross Surgery we are one of the top achieving practices in the area. We have a team of Stop Smoking Advisors working within the Practice.

We are currently running Stop Smoking Information Sessions. The sessions last for seven weeks. Each Information Session lasts for approximately an hour a week and must be attended to maximise your chance of successful quitting.

We run two separate clinics, the first is on a Tuesday evening held between 5.30-6.30pm and the second clinic is held on a Wednesday evening between 5pm – 6pm.
